N.B.

To allow time to become immersed in the language, we don't advise calling to speak personally with students for the first 5 days. However, one of our team will be more than happy to give you an update. In any event, students are given time to write letters home on the first postal day of the course.

Visiting Dates & Times (Cuirteanna – Dátaí agus Amantaí)

Written parental permission via letter or email is required for anyone other than a parent to take a student out.

As a safety precaution, any such letter or email must contain the student's date of birth.

Students are **not** permitted to return to the Bean an Tí's house during visiting times. **There is no visiting on the 23rd June.**

Sunday 9th June (Dombnach 9 Meitheamh) :

Students can be collected from the college at 2.30 p.m. and must be returned by 6.00 p.m. We ask parents to respect these times as the Bean an Tí will have dinner prepared for all students before they leave in the afternoon.

Sunday 16th June (Dombnach 16 Meitheamh) :

Parents are invited to attend a concert which begins at 11.30. This follows a short talk from the Director about our aftercare services and provides an opportunity for parents to meet teachers and discuss their student's progress and their next step after the course. Students must be returned by 6.00 p.m.

Items to bring (Nithe le tabhairt)

Please ensure all personal belongings are clearly labelled.

It is also important that all luggage (suitcases, bags, etc) have 'RMM' written in big & clear capital letters on their outside, preferably in chalk. All luggage should also be clearly labelled with student's name. This also applies to those travelling in cars and ensures luggage between courses doesn't get mixed up at beginning and end of each course.

Doctor's Cheque, Pocket Money & Bus Money must each be placed in *individual* envelopes and marked as follows:

ÁBHAR: ['*Subject*', i.e. on each envelope, there will be one subject – Doctors Cheque, Pocket Money or Bus Money]

AINM: ['*Name*' in Irish]

MÉID: ['*Amount*' – With the doctor's envelope, please use this heading to specify if cheque or medical card is enclosed]

Medicine, musical instruments, sports equipment, hair straighteners and any food or drink brought on the course will be collected at the beginning of the course. Students will have access to them when necessary or at allocated times.

The following is designed as a general guide of items to bring on the course:

Ginearálta (General)

- Airgead Póca. **Pocket Money** – there will be roughly one visit to the shop per day. There is no bank or bank link available to students on any course.
- Seic €60 don Dochtúir. **€60 cheque** payable to SPLEODAR for doctor/medical bills, which will be returned if unused. Cárta leighis (**Medical Card**) may alternatively be provided if applicable. This must **not** be a photocopy.
- Clúdaigh Litreach réamhstampáilte. **Stamped-addressed Envelopes**. Stamps can be difficult for students to acquire whilst on the course.
- Cóipleabhar don rang agus peann. **Hardback copy and pens for class**.
- Foclóir Béarla/Gaeilge. **English/Irish Dictionary**.

Eadaí (Clothes)

Please ensure student brings enough clothes for 3 weeks. In relation to **washing**, the Bean An Tí will wash underwear, socks, t-shirts and towels. **An old pillow case or net bag** for the washing machine is necessary. Sometimes it may be useful for the student, if parent is coming up for two Sunday visits, to bring up more clothes and take away used clothes, etc.

- **Good Raincoat with Hood. A Hoody will not suffice.** - Cóta maith Báistí le Cochall.
- **Runners or good walking shoes.** - Bróga maithe reatha nó bróga maithe siúlóide.
- **Small rucksack/bag.** - Mála droma beag.
- **Sports clothes and swimming togs.** - Éadaí spóirt agus snámha.
- **Towels.** - Tuáillí.
- **Sun Cream** - Lóis gréine.
- **Roll-on deodorant** - Díbhollaíoch rollógach. - **We ask students not to bring any sprays. Any sprays will be confiscated.**
- **Insect Repellent.** - Éarthach feithidí.

Spórt & Ceol (Sport & Music) *

- **Uirlisí Ceoil. Musical instruments. Please check if instrument is covered under house insurance.**
- **Camán & Clogad. Hurley & Helmet. Students will not be permitted to play hurling/camogie without a helmet.**

Miscellaneous (Ilchineálach)

- **Lunch Box.** - Bosca lóin.
- **Good Water Flask.** This will allow students use our water coolers whenever necessary- Buidéal Uisce
- Any **costumes, wigs, etc.** which may be useful for dress-up céilís and competitions. *

* **Optional.**

In the event that any item in possession of a student is deemed **dangerous**, or otherwise in breach of the terms and conditions, such student will be asked to hand the item over to a member of staff. Such possession may be seen as a serious breach of discipline. Any item that is deemed dangerous will **not** be returned to the student at the end of the course under any circumstances.

Directions (Treoracha)

It is important to note that even upon arrival in Galway city, it can take over an hour to reach the centre. More specific directions from your own location can be found using the 'AA Route Planner', which can be found by typing 'AA Route Planner' into Google (or alternatively by clicking [here](#)). The destination here should be entered as 'Ros Muc'.

Upon arrival in Galway there are two options:

a) Clifden Road N59

- Head through Moycullen and Oughterard;
- At Maam Cross turn left (Peacocks Hotel on right);
- Follow the R336 road for around 18 km;
- There is a school on right & football field on the left;
- Turn left at football field, signed 'Ros Muc';
- Continue for 2 km & centre is located on the right just blue shop, which is on the left.

b) Coast Road

- Head through Na Forbacha, Spidéal & Indearbhán;
- At Casla (Costello) turn right R336, sign-posted 'Ros Muc';
- After following this road for 12 km you will come to its end at a T Junction, then turn left;
- After 5km there is a school on right & football field on the left;
- Turn left at football field, signed 'Ros Muc';
- Continue for 2 km & centre is located on the right just **before** the big blue shop, which is on the left.

Travel Arrangements (Sonraí Taistil)

Students can arrive at the course via **car** or via our **privately hired buses**. Although some students arrive via car, generally students not located near to the course take the bus. It is entirely up to you.

- If arriving via **car**, students should arrive at the college between 4.30 p.m. & 5.30 p.m. Our staff will be there to meet parents and student and to divide all luggage into two groups – *buachaillí* & *cailíní*. Pick-up time on Wednesday 26th is 8.45 a.m. Please ensure student knows at beginning of course whether they will be getting the car or bus home.
- All students are automatically reserved a place on the bus. There is **NO NEED** to contact office to **CONFIRM OR CANCEL** a space on a bus.

- N.B.**
- **Students will need a packed lunch for the bus journey.**
 - Envelope with money for the bus (as discussed above) is collected at the beginning of the course.

Although students are generally not permitted to leave the course, if exception to this is granted, the student must leave the centre with parent or person who has consent of parent in the form of a permission letter or email. No student may leave the course by any other means, including public transport and private taxis.

Reminder of Spleodar Rules

We would remind all parents and students that you have signed to say that you understand and accept the following:

N.B.

I understand that if my student speaks one full sentence in English that it will entail his/her immediate dismissal from Spleodar. I understand that dismissal will also follow a serious breach of discipline. I understand that if my Student is dismissed from the course they must be collected promptly from the centre and there will be no refund of fee.

1. **Gaeilge.** All students must speak in Irish **all the time** from the minute that they come under the care of the Coláiste staff. This becomes operational once the students are on the bus.
2. **Guthán.** Students are not allowed to bring a mobile phone. Possession of a mobile will be seen as a major breach of discipline.
3. **Grúpaí.** Every Student must stay in a group with a leader at all times. No one is allowed to go anywhere on his or her own or with another student.

It is important that students know both Amhrán Na bhFiann & Amhrán An Choláiste.
